Dr Brian A de Vries (BBA, M.Div., Th.M., Ph.D.) is Principal and Senior Lecturer at *Mukhanyo Theological College*. He is a minister of the Reformed Churches of South Africa (GKSA), sent to South Africa in 2005 as a missionary of the Heritage Reformed Congregations of North America (HRC-NA). Dr de Vries is presently leading his third church plant in South Africa and also serves as senior lecturer in the Faculty of Theology at North-West University and visiting professor at Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary in the United States. Dr Conrad Mbewe has served as pastor of Kabwata Baptist Church since 1987 and has been the principal of the Lusaka Ministerial College during various periods of its existence.
