The purpose of education?

- "The purpose of education has always been to every one, in essence, the same—to give the [learners] the things they need in order to develop in an orderly, sequential way into members of society." —John Dewey, "Individual Psychology and Education," The Philosopher, 12, 1934.

The purpose of education?

- A common consensus:
 Education does not have a single purpose; it serves multiple objectives, and the relative importance of each of these objectives can be very personal.
- To cultivate a skilled and/or effective workforce
- To serve social needs or contribute to the economy
- To teach cultural literacy or to develop the intellect
- To promote a particular social or political system

The purpose of education?




Classified according to motives/philosophy:

Individual	Personal advancement, to grow and develop, an opportunity to get ahead
Secular	To teach, or pass on information, from one person to another – basically shuffling papers, shuffling knowledge
Societal [agendas]	Poverty alleviation, social upliftment, Community transformation, etc.
Specific [agendas]	Indoctrination, political aspirations, military recruitment, discipleship, etc.

"Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Timothy 2:15)


Mentorship

Implications for Bible education



Theological education is...

2. More than just knowledge & critical thinking

"The function of education is to teach one to think intensively and to think critically. But education which stops with efficiency may prove the greatest menace to society. The most dangerous criminal may be the man gifted with reason but no morals. ... We must remember



that intelligence is not enough. Intelligence plus character-that is the goal of true education." - Martin Luther King Jr., 1948.

 - · to train the masses, to solve problem of illiteracy
 - · to eliminate poverty and suffering





- 5. Missional PIETY (prayers)




